

#### PERSONAL INFORMATION

All taxpayers will need the following to do their taxes

Your Social Security number (SSN), ITIN, or tax ID number

Your Spouses full name (as listed on the social security card), SSN, or ITIN, date of birth

Stimulus payment information – form 1444

Identity Protection PIN – only if the IRS has issued one to you, your spouse, or any of your dependents

Banking Information (only if you would like to receive your refund by Direct Deposit or if you plan on paying your amount due to the IRS) – bank routing number, account number. Your ATM/debit card number will not work

#### **DEPENDENT(S) INFORMATION**

All dependent's that have lived with you at least 6 months out of the year

Dependent(s) information - full name (as listed on the social security card), SSN, or ITIN, date of birth, relation to the dependent (son, daughter, grandchild, parent, etc)

School aged children – school student profile record

 Children under the age of 5 if not attending school should bring in a copy of immunization record or record from a local doctor

Childcare records – including the child care provider's SSN, EIN, or TIN Any income of dependent's (even if the dependent is a minor)
Form 8332 (if applicable) custodial parent releasing their right to claim the child to you, if you share custody of the child with a non-spouse

W2(s)

1099 G – Unemployment payments

Itemized statement of fees paid to a licensed day care center Amounts paid to a baby-sitter or child care provider to your child under the age of 13 while away working

## W7 – ITIN Application or Renewal

If you would like to apply for or renew your or your dependent's ITIN

Full name as listed on the Identification Card, passport, or Consulate ID Card, or previously issued ITIN document

Date of birth

Date you first entered the United States

Original Passport (must be mailed to Department of Immigration) -or-

Consulate ID card -and-

Original birth certificate
